OUR INSTITUTION

Government College Barsar, District Hamirpur (HP) was founded in 2007 as a co-educational college. It was set up by the Department of Higher Education, HP. The college is affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla-5 and is covered under section 2(f) of UGC act 1956. The college is recently accredited with grade "C" by NAAC Begaluru. It imparts education in Humanities, Commerce and Science at under graduate level. The college also runs self-financing courses BCA, BBA and PGDCA under Higher Education Institute Society. The college has its own campus located at Baroli at a distance of 1 Km from Barsar. It is spread over an area of 8.12 acreand is on the Una-Barthin State Highway (SH 37). It is 4 kms from the sub-divisional office Barsar at Mehre and 32 kms from district headquarter Hamirpur. The nearest railway station is at Una nearly 48 kms and nearest air port is at Gaggal district Kangra. It lies in laps of Solhasinghi dhar of lower Shivalik Himalayas. Our college is blessed by Shri Baba Balak Nath Sidh Pith at Deotsidh which is close to Bhakhra reservoir in Bilaspur District. The college possesses adequate in frastructure in terms of classrooms, laboratories, library, playground, canteen and girls' common room. It is a rural college which caters to the needs of people from backward areas. Some students travel 25-30 kms on hilly track to reach the college. In the recent past college has developed two computer labs for science and humanities (Rs 20,81,616/-), two smart class room, one conference hall, badminton court (Rs 2,14,400/-), furniture for multipurpose hall, library, class rooms, girls common room (Rs 5,54,600/-). The college library also upgraded by purchase of 204 books (Rs 1,59,165/-). Keeping in view greater number of girl student two vending-sanitary napkin machines (Rs 1,24,954/-), CCTV cameras (16 number, 1,26,783/-) and boundary wall (Rs 17,00,000/-) installed/build in campus. Two storey building i.e. canteen cum examination hall for nearly 500 students, was constructed out of RUSA grant (Rs 63,00,000/-). Rupees 63,150/- spent on purchase of sport goods. A photocopier at the cost of Rs 1,01,674/- and a Digiset for Rs 1,69,000/- was purchased out of RUSA grant to facilitate the student in the library. The campus is fully Wi-Fi as Rs 79,500/- were spent on it. Presently RUSA and IQAC cells are continuously monitoring the needs of students.

ADMISSION UNDER UGC CBCS (RUSA)

The Govt. of Himachal Pradesh has introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) under the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) from the academic session 2013 - 14 and these regulations have been called the HPU Regulations for CBCS and Continuous Assessment Grading Pattern (CAGP) for UG Programmes. However, after adopting the UGC CBCS pattern by H.P. University from the academic session 2018 - 19, the university clarified that eligibility conditions regarding the age limit, pass percentage or minimum eligibility etc. at the entry level to B.A./B.Com/B.Sc. 1st year system remains the same as mentioned in the original HP University ordinance.

GENERAL RULES FOR ADMISSION TO UNDERGRADUATE CLASSES:

- Admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. 1st year Classes will be strictly on fulfilment of eligibility 1. conditions as under:
 - a) A pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education (or in case of Shashtri, pass in PrakShashtrifrom Sanskrit Colleges affiliated to the HPU) or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of the H.P. University.
 - i. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. programme.
 - ii. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. Programme.
- 2. An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girls only) as on the year concerned i.e. 01/07/2021. The upper age limit shall be raised by 3 years for students belonging to SC and ST category. However, in case of overage applicant, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, H.P. University, at his discretion, may give relaxation of 6 months to the eligible students.
- 3. An applicant having passed 10+2 examination with English as one of the compulsory subjects from any Board/University recognized by H.P Govt. or H.P. University or Association of Indian Universities can seek admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. 1st year.
- Students coming from Vocational Stream without having Maths/Economics and Maths/Biology, 4. as the case may be, as one of the compulsory subjects at +2 levels shall be admitted to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. 1styear. as per the requisite minimum pass percentage prescribed for admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. 1styear.
- Admission to the various classes will be made on merit and on the recommendation of the 5. admission committee constituted for the purpose.

- 6. Admission is also open to an applicant who has an equivalent degree from Foreign University/ Board/College which is recognized by H.P. Govt. or H.P. University or Association of Indian Universities provided the applicant fulfils the minimum eligibility conditions.
- 7. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidate.
- Initially all admission shall be provisional and subject to the final approval by H.P. University. 8.
- Rules of admission are subject to change as per the H.P. University notifications issued from 9. time to time.
- Any gap of year or more in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by 10. documentary evidence/affidavit as the proof of his/her activities during the period of gap. Submission of false affidavit is a legal offence.
- 11. The applicant must fill up the Application Form in his/her handwriting and get it signed by his/her parents/local guardian.
- 12. The Application Form must be completed in all respects along with the following documents:
 - a) Attested copies of detailed marks card of the previous examinations passed. In case of nonreceipt of this certificate, the applicant must attach the certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - b) Attested copy of Matriculation certificate for verification of date of birth.
 - c) Original Character certificate from the institution last attended.
- 13. Applicant must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
- 14. Applicant coming from Boards/Universities other than H.P Board of School Education Dharamshala / H.P. University Shimla must provide migration certificate in original.
- Girls students seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of H.P. Bonafide 15. certificate to avail themselves the benefit of tuition fee-concession.
- 16. Divyang student seeking exemption from tuition fee on the basis of disability must attach an attested copy of 40% or more disability certificate from the competent Authority.
- 17. All terms and conditions and fee structure can be changed or modified as per the directions or instruction of the H.P. University/H.P. Govt.

CHANGE OF SUBJECT

The change in one Subject (DSC Subject only) is permissible within fifteen days of admission. Student may submit an application for change of subject to the Principal. The change of DSC subject will be allowed only out of available subject combinations.

MIGRATION

The migration of students migrating during the same course/session from any affiliated college or institution (including ICDEOL) to another affiliated college or institution shall be governed by the regulations framed by the Executive Council of the University from time to time.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

Regulations for the Under Graduate Programmes (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.)

1. The CBCS System:

It is an instructional package developed to suit the needs of students to keep pace with the developments in higher education worldwide. The student in this system has considerable freedom in choosing courses and so making his/ her own personalized programme. The programme is considered completed when the student cumulates the requisite number of successful credits (passed), i.e.at least 132 (for UGC CBCS pattern) for an undergraduate degree.

2. Outlines of UGC Choice Based Credit System:

- 1. Core Course: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
- 2. Elective Course: Generally a course which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: An elective course offered under the main discipline/ subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
- 2.2 Dissertation/Project: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
- 2.3 Generic Elective (GE) Course (Only for B.A./B.Com Classes): The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline(s) of choice is called a Generic Elective.
- Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement;
- i. Environmental Science and ii. English/ MIL (Modern Indian Languages)- Hindi Communication / Sanskrit Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
- 3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/ MIL (Modern Indian Languages) /Hindi Communication/Sanskrit Communication.
- 3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

- 4. Practical/tutorials: The list of practical provided is suggestive in nature and each university has the freedom to add/subtract/edit practical from the list depending on their faculty and infrastructure available. Addition will however be of similar nature.
- 5. Project work/Dissertation: Introducing Research Component in Under-Graduate Courses a Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

3. **Eligibility for Admission:**

- A pass in the Higher Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of the H.P. University.
- Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with arts/ b. humanities stream shall be given preference in admission to B.A. Programme.
- Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science C. stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. programme.
- d) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. programme.

4. **Duration (Time Frame):**

The UG (TDC) programme is for a minimum period of three years and a maximum of five years from the date of admission of the candidate. At present yearly system has been adopted for 1st, 2nd and 3rd year.

5. **Programmes Offered:**

The UG (TDC) Programme in a college affiliated to the HPU will comprise the following categories of courses:

- B.A. (Arts) (I)
 - a. English, Hindi.
 - b. Economics, Geography, Political Science, History, Music (Vocal), Mathematics.
- (II) B.Sc. (Science)
 - a. Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics.
 - b. Botany, Zoology, Chemistry.
- **B.Com.** (Commerce) (III)
 - a. Commerce.

7. For the Degree:

a. The candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a College affiliated to the H.P. University for a period not less than three academic years and not more than five academic years, should have passed the examination prescribed and fulfilled such conditions as have been prescribed therefore.

- b. For the degree (BA / B.Sc. / B.Com.) the student will have to cumulate a minimum of 132 successful credit hours of coursework over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission.
- c. Provided that not more than three attempts will be allowed to pass a course.

8. Annual System:

An academic year comprising 180 working days. With six working days in a week. Considering that each teaching day has 5 teaching/working hours, a teaching week would have 5×6=30 working / teaching hours available for each student.

9. **Credits:**

The term 'credit' refers to the weight age given to a course, usually in terms of the number of instructional hours per week assigned to it. This explains why usually 'credit' is taken to mean 'credit hours'. For the purpose of credit determination, instruction is divided into three components:-

- (1) **Lectures (L) -** Classroom lectures of one hour's duration
- Tutorials (T) Special, elaborate instructions on specific topics (from Lectures) of one (2) hour duration.
- (3) **Practicals (P)** - Laboratory of field exercises in which the student has to do experiments or other practical work of two hours duration.

Each one of these components is considered as equal to one credit. One lecture (L) as well as one Tutorial (T) of one hour a week is considered as one credit, whereas one Practical (P) of two hours a week is considered as one credit. The total weight age given to a course in terms of credits will be equal to L + T + P, where L is the number of one hour Lectures per week, T is the number of one hour Tutorials per week, and P is the number of two hour Practical per week. This can be written in symbols as:-

$$C = L + T + P$$

Where, *C* is the credit weightage for a particular course.

The total minimum credits required for an under graduate degree programme is one hundred and twenty (132).

10. Course:

A course is a structured set of instructions that are imparted to a student on the basis of a syllabus or a framework. Each course is designed variously under instructions given as Lectures, Tutorials, and Practicals (laboratory and field exercises). Usually these components are referred to as L, T and P components.

11. **Examination & Evaluation system:**

The evaluation system in CBCS with all courses has the following two components:

- Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade (i) that a student gets in a course; and.
- (ii) Annual Examination_accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

- (i) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): This would have the following components:
- Classroom Attendance Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures / (a) Tutorials + Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.
- ** Provided that those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.
- ** Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a Medical Certificate from a Government Hospital.
- * Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g. NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.
- * Provided further that those getting these exemptions will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below:

Those having greater than 75% attendance (for those participating in co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to percent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows:-

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≥ 75% but < 80%......3 mark
≥ 80% but < 90%.....4 marks
≥ 90%
             .....5 marks
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- (b) Mid-Term Test - There will Mid-term test of 15 marks on completion of 75% syllabus. Question paper for the mid-term test will be made by the teacher of the course and will be evaluated by him/her. Evaluated test booklets will be provided to the students (shown in the class) and they can be given photocopies of the same for the cost of photocopying.
- Seminar / Assignment / Term Paper -(c)
 - i. The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar / assignment / general behaviour of students that the course teacher might give to the students.
 - ii. Remaining 5 marks of CCA will be awarded on the basis of attendance as per the criteria mentioned above:
- (ii) **Annual Examination:** The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of final examination, that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.
- In annual system examination will be held in the month of April / May.
- If a student is not permitted to appear in the final examination due to shortage of attendance beyond the exemption limit (<50% attendance), the candidate will be permitted to move to the next semester, Such candidates shall redo the missed semester after completing the rest of the programme.

12. Right to Appeal:

The photocopies of the evaluated answer books will be made available to the students for a fee (to be decided depending on the cost of reproduction per answer book and the administrative charges to be decided by the college administration) to be paid in advance.

- The students will have the right to make an appeal against any component of evaluation. Such appeal has to be made to the Principal of the College on a prescribed form and should clearly state in writing the reason(s) for the complaint / appeal.
- The appeal will be placed before the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC), Chaired by the College Principal, comprising:
- (i) For cases pertaining to the Major subject (core or elective courses): the Head of the Department, Course Teacher, of the Department.
- For cases pertaining to the Elective subjects: the Head of the concerned Department and (ii) Course Teacher of the Department.
 - The Committee will consider the case and may give a personal hearing to the appellant before deciding the case. The decision of the Committee will be final.

13. Determining GPA and CGPA:

The marks obtained in the Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and the Final Examination will be combined and used for the deciding of the course grade that the student will be getting. Grading will be done by the Office of the Controller of Examination (COE) HPU for each course class in all the colleges.

- In case a loss of a book or any damage, the borrower will have to replace the book with a new 7) copy at market value.
- 8) Over-date due & fine is Rs. 1/- per day.
- 9) College also provides Book Bank facility sponsored by PTA for the needy and eritorious students.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

For the quality improvement of higher education, the college has an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). From time to time all important decisions pertaining to the betterment of the college as well as students are taken by the members of IQAC.

- 4. The college will provide limited financial support as permitted under rules.

REMEDIAL COACHING CELL

The college is recognized by UGC under section 2(f). So, the college is planning to establish a remedial coaching Centre to the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer), minorities/PD/BPL categories. General category students can also avail this facility. There shall be a remedial class by the end of every week (Saturday).

The college CSCA along with the college administration organize the inter faculty cultural function for students to represent their faculties.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE "SHATRUPA"

To nourish the creativity among the students, the college magazine SHATRUPA is published every year. It has many sections like Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Pahari and Science. One student editor for each section is also appointed in the beginning of academic session.

CAREER GUIDANCE, COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL

The UGC formulated Career Guidance, Counselling and Placement Cell has been constituted in the college with an aim to prepare the students for job or self-reliance. The cell consists of a core committee and various faculty wise sub- committees which will undertake the various activities from time to time. The cell will provide the placement opportunities to students by facilitating various companies/private firms for conducting job programmes/tests/interviews etc.

Annual function of the college is organized in every year. PRIZES/AWARDS

Prizes are given to the students achieving distinction in house exams, University exams, excellence in sports, NSS/Rovers and Rangers/Red Ribbon Club and other co-curricular activities organized from time to time in the college, University and Inter-University level. These prizes are awarded in the annual function of the college organized in the month of February/March at the end every year.

TERM END EXAMINATION

- To appear in university examination a student will have to fulfil 75% lecture condition (75% in theory and 75% in practical). The attendance will be counted from the first day of the commencement of teaching work/admission.
- 2. The MTT examinations will be conducted in the months of December in annual system. A student will have to obtain at least 45% marks in each subject to become eligible for appearing in University final examinations.
- For the purpose of determining "Eligibility to appear in the University Examination," the existing 3. provisions in the HPU ordinance shall continue to be adhered to as such.

OUR HEALTHY PRACTICES

ATTENDANCE:

- 75% lecture attendance is compulsory for appearing in the University Exams. (i)
- (ii) An irregular student or one who remains absent continuously for 07 days his/her name will be struck-off from the college rolls. If the name of a student is struck of twice then he/she will not be re-admitted in the college.
- (iii) A student is liable to pay all dues & fines as long as his/her name remains on the college
- The Principal reserves the right of expulsion/suspension of any student. (iv)

LEAVE RULES

- Application for any kind of leave on the prescribed Performa should be submitted well in time.
- (ii) Leave up to three days will be sanctioned by the concerned subject teacher.
- Leave above three days up to six days will be sanctioned by the Head of Department. (iii) Leave for more than six days will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of concerned subject teacher.
- In case of a medical leave for a period of over six days the applicant must produce a (iv) medical certificate.

Important Note: Students participating in Inter-College competitions should note that the practice/rehearsal timings should be either before the classes (early morning) or after the classes (evening) because all such activities form a part, but not the substitute of academic studies.

LIBRARY CUM IDENTITY CARD (I-CARD)

- Every student will be issued an identity card. Since I-Card is the only medium to identify/differentiate a bonafide college student from an outsider. Every student must always keep/carry it with him/her and must produce whenever required (during all working days, during examination and college function etc.) Otherwise, he/she will be considered an outsider and will be punished accordingly.
- II. In case the I-Card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued only after an FIR is registered with the nearest police station and an original copy thereof is appended with such request.
- III. Rs. 20/- is to be deposited for a duplicate identity card.

PROCEDURE FOR MAKING 'I-CARD'

After depositing admission fee & due every student shall get an I-Card from the college librarian on showing his/her fee receipt. After having affixed his/her own photograph and filled in all the entries in the I-Card, every student must get it duly signed by the respective senior tutor within one week from the date of admission positively.

GENERAL CONDUCT/DISCIPLINE RULES

j) Use of mobile phones by the students in and around the classrooms is strictly banned. Defaulters will be penalised.

Note: All students must note that Ragging inside/outside the college campus is a cognizable offence.

In case a student is found guilty of indiscipline in any activity in any manner, the college administration shall take appropriate action against such offenders.

POINTS TO REMEMBER

- 1st Period will begin at 10.00 am daily and each period shall be of one-hour duration. I.
- II. Every student must always carry his/her Identity card which is issued to the students after admission. It should be shown/produced on demand.

- III. All admissions to the college shall be provisional and subject to the approval of H.P. University. The college shall not be held responsible for cancellation of admission/candidature of any student by the University.
- IV. Students should not temper with the electrical and water fittings in the class rooms and in the college campus.
- V. Using foul language shall be viewed seriously.
- VI. Writing obscenities, loitering aimlessly, damage to the college property, bringing outsiders, misbehaving with the staff will be construed as misconduct/indiscipline and punished with either fine or suspension/expulsion or both
- VII. Any instance of ragging should immediately be brought in the notice of members of anti-ragging squad/committee.
- VIII. Go through the College Notice Board Daily.
- IX. Smoking or taking of intoxicants, liquor etc. is strictly prohibited in the college campus.

Anti- Ragging/ Indiscipline Rules

In order to have zero tolerance to ragging and its total elimination from the educational institutions, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its order dated 4th May, 2001, 16th May, 2007 and 11th Feb., 2009 has directed as here under:

- 1. Ragging is banned in the institution.
- 2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be Exemplary and Justifiable harsh.
- 3. Punishment for ragging includes:
 - (i) Imprisonment / fine or both.
 - (ii) Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
 - (iii) Withholding scholarships or other benefits.
 - (iv) Debarring from representation in events.
 - (v) Withholding of results.
 - (vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.

- 4. In the hostels, the entry of seniors and outsiders shall be prohibited before and after specified hours of the day except under the authority or the persons in-charge (Warden or Hostel Superintendent).
- 5. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment shall be resorted to.
- 6. Character/migration certificate(s) issued by the institution shall have and entry apart from that of general conduct and behaviour to the effect whether the student had participated in ragging and in particular was punished for ragging.
- 7. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/ indiscipline in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith. For Himachal Pradesh University Act, statutes and ordinances as amended till date log in on university website www.hpuniv.nic.in (Right to information-H.P. University Act & ordinance, Vol-I, Vol-II, Vol-III).


